Report from the Chair

As I sit and write this, I am amazed to think back on what we have actually managed to do in such a dreadful year. We have had a lot of support from members with feedback on the various events that we have managed to run. When I look back to those early days of 2020, with a visit to Pinkham's Vets at Wilton in the RDA arena, I can only smile because it was a great evening with demos and a talk and so many of you made it. We had such plans for others! A 'Talk and Chat' at Grovely was well attended and Sam the Head Girl gave us an insight into her first

years' experience in the Eventing World, then Covid-19 struck and we had to sit at home. But again, we did manage to pull off some training sessions with Emily and Ride Coach Ride events and capped this off. We had a very successful series of Day Camps — albeit limited in numbers who could take part and run under thoroughly controlled and socially distanced rules. I wanted to take this opportunity to thank three individuals from the committee who contributed so much time and effort to getting this stuff off the ground, so a round of applause please for Hazel, Ali and Lorna THANK YOU SO MUCH XXXX.

Big shout out to say thank you to Kate, her videos were much appreciated and a great start to lateral thinking as the lockdown bit in March. We had plans to roll out TREK but again Covid-19 put pay to that - but it's a temporary blip! Do you recall Amanda Bartons talk on Endurance riding the previous year, maybe something to think about going onwards?

I managed to get a newsletter out each month and frankly your support on this has kept me going because people have come up with items that they felt were important and that made it easier to construct. I hope they brought some comfort and enjoyment. Obviously, it's not quite the same as a 'Talk and Chat' or an event but we had to do what we could in difficult times. Again, I must mention Hazel and her relentless efforts to promote the club and its 'activity' on Facebook because we have acquired a great following. Let's hope we can maintain that and add to the membership for 2021. This brings me round to a couple of things that need to be promoted.

I want to begin with the membership and importance we place on that. This year we have lost about 20% of the membership, mainly due to the cessation of competitions through the summer months when we would normally pick up about 12 / 14 members who liked what they saw when they came to Wilton RDA for dressage competitions, and subsequently joined our happy band of brothers. As we close this year down we have just 42 members and I encourage you to rejoin this forthcoming year so that we can carry the club forward. BRC have advised us that they have had to increase the clubs fees for 2021 due to higher insurance costs. We as a committee have made the decision not to pass these increases on to you as we want to provide value to our members and this is not the time to increase the charges. Besides we raised the fees last year, so 2021 fees will remain at £25.00.

I also wanted to highlight the Pleasure Riding Scheme run by Caroline. I suspect that those hours in a saddle have kept some of you sane, they have been a godsend to me and I only joined in September. I have the current participating membership which I wanted to publish to just trigger some interest and pay homage to those who really have gone for it!

There are 14 members in this scheme – the cost is £10.00 per year, renewable on the joining anniversary, so effectively a rolling year.

Report from the Treasurer

Below is the financial report from our Treasurer, the 2020 Accounts are attached with this newsletter

An appraisal of the account:

We started the year in January 2020 with £4,047.01 in the account. We generated an income of £3574.10 and spent £3625.27- resulting in a small loss of £51.22 (including an un-banked cheque of £28.80)

WRC income has been produced from the following activities:

- A) Membership
- B) 3x Dressage events in the form of Ride Coach Ride
- C) 2 Training sessions
- D) Sadly, only one Talk and Chat
- E) 3 x Day Camps
- A) The membership fees generated £1,050.00, but from this £890 has been paid to the BRC for the insurance and affiliation fees. The current subscription fee is £25 but it is noted that the BRC fees are increasing from 1st December 2020 the cost is estimated at £16 cost per head for each member. The committee has voted to NOT increase subscription fees for 2021.
- B) The dressage events in the form of Ride Coach Ride this year have resulted in a boost to our accounts with an overall profit of £432 over just 3 events.
- C) The 2 training sessions with Emily Harris covered the cost of instructor and RDA hire.
- D) The one Talk and Chat evenings with Sam from Grovely covered its costs. The other was a free invitation to the Pinkhams equine evening at their Wilton centre, donations were encouraged to support RDA.
- E) Our 3 day camps covered the costs and made a tiny profit of £17.

We continue to work closely with the Riding for the Disabled at Wilton and it is important to note that our use of their facilities is helping to support and generate income for the upkeep of the Centre. This year our 3 dressage events, 2 training sessions and 3 Day Camps meant that there was a payment in total the RDA of £605 in hire fees.

We have also donated £100 for sponsorship of four RDA ponies.

The club has assets valued at approximately £350. The balance on 21st November 2020 is £4024.59
